HELD ON June 27, 2019**

**BE IT REMEMBERED THAT** the Board of Trustees of the Village of Riverview, St. Louis County, Missouri, met at City Hall, 9699 Lilac Drive at 7:00 pm on June 27, 2019.

Trustee Steve Paro held a moment of silence for fallen North County Officer Mike Langsdorf.

**CITIZENS' COMMENTS, SUGGESTIONS, AND PETITIONS:**

Mrs. Ritchey on Grosvenor commented about a property on Habecking and Northgate. She stated the grass and weeds were very overgrown. Trustee Steve Paro mentioned the street department would be made aware. Village Clerk Sarah stated it may be a property that may already be on the list to be cut. Trustee Craig Boehmer stated it may already be cut. Mrs. Ritchey stated it was the house that had the tree fall. Trustee Steve Paro stated the street department has been working hard to keep up. Trustee Craig Boehmer mentioned how many lots were cut. Village Clerk Sarah Jurgena stated the total was 108 lots cut by Joey.

Trustee Steve Paro complimented Village Clerk Sarah Jurgena on the community clean up day. Village Clerk Sarah Jurgena thanked the four trustees that came out to help and the rest of the community that pitched in. There were 45 volunteers and about 70 bags of trash were picked up. It was a great turn out. More discussion on the matter.

Howard Pierce who lives at 486 Scenic stated he has lived in the village for 56 years and this is the most overgrown it has ever been. He stated people do not cut their grass and fence lines are a problem. He stated there is also a problem with wild animals and mosquitos. He stated his neighbors are renters and they do not care about their property. He requested that the Village hand deliver letters to people about their grass. Discussion about the waste of postage by sending letters out that come back. Trustee Patricia Lewis stated one of the reasons we have so many animals is due to the recent flooding. More discussion of tall grass and weeds. Village Clerk Sarah Jurgena stated the hand delivery of the letters would be something the police department would need to be involved in. Further discussion.

**Adjournment:**




