Public Works Liaison's Report: Trustee Bruce Stocker reported that for the month of May 2018, the Street Department:
Cleaned city hall daily, trash out of city hall daily, cut 53 lots, cut city hall lot 4 times, cut Brad Schultz park 3 times, cut Elementary park 2 times, picked up trash under bridge 3 times, picked up 2 dead animals, picked up trash dumped on Valley Dr., Picked up branches on Valley Dr., picked up trash on Spring Garden 2 times and changed brakes on police car #41 on 5-23-18.

Police Liaison's Report: Trustee Phyllis Paro reported that there were:

Health Commissioner's Report: Trustee Craig Boehmer read the Health Inspector Report. There were 2 letters/warnings for trash and debris, 40 high grass warnings, 2 warnings for no occupancy permit and 1 animal at large warning. There were 4 summonses issued for no occupancy permits, 1 summons issued for trash and debris, 1 summons issued for trash dumpster violation and 1 summons issued for no business license.
